Old Scotch Football Club CRACKERS CHRONICLES – THE THIRTIES

Welcome back to "Crackers Chronicles". This week we trace some of the history of the Old Scotch Football Club by recounting the contributions of five of our Life Members from the highly successful 1930s.

E. McC. Ewen Davidson ("Ginner")

Ewen Davidson, known as "Ginner" (a corruption of 'Ginger' for his red hair), a champion schoolboy athlete, was recruited from *Scotch College* in 1927, but played while still at school. He played seven seasons for the *Old Scotch Collegians Football Club*, in 1927 and then from 1932 – 1937. He played in our A Section premiership teams of 1932 & 1933, and captained the club in 1936 & 1937. Ginner taught PE at *Scotch College* from 1932 until his retirement in 1973. He was Secretary of the *Old Scotch Collegians' Association* from 1958 – 1973.

He was awarded a Life Member of the Club in 1972 and President of the Old Scotch Collegians' Association in 1977. Ginner died in 1989.

Our annual award to a senior player of "Team Player of the Year" is named after Ewen Davidson.

V. T. Vern Tilley

Vern Tilley, an *Old Scotch Boy*, was the fourth Secretary of the *Old Scotch Collegians Football Club* for 12 years from 1932 – 1948. He was a premiership Secretary in 1932, 1933 & 1934. After World War II, in 1946 Vern helped re-form the club when all pre-war club officials resumed their

He then went on to become the fourth President of our club for six years from 1953 – 1958. He was awarded a Life Member of the Club in 1949, and made a Patron of the Club in 1959. Vern died in 1984.

Baron Marks

Baron Marks was an *Old Scotch Boy* Councillor of the Melbourne City Council. Under Bill Everard, Baron was Vice President of the *Old Scotch Collegians Football Club* for eight years from 1933 – 1939 & 1947.

In 1932, he donated the "Baron Marks Cup" for A section premiers as replacement for the "McBean Cup" won by Old Scotch in 1931.

He was elected a Life Member of the Club in 1937 and later helped re-form the Club after World War II. Baron died in 1947.

C. M. Colin Gilray ("The Blue")

Colin Gilray, known as "The Blue", was Principal of *Scotch College* from 1934 – 1953. For the security of the club, it was considered very important to maintain a close relationship with the School. He was awarded a Life Member of the Club in 1935. Colin died in 1974.

L. A. Augustine "Gus" Dobrigh

Gus Dobrigh was a former Collingwood Football Club 1917 premiership player from 1914 – 1921 and Port Melbourne Football Club player from 1922 – 1924. Also, he was a former coach of the Northcote Football Club in 1925 and the Preston Football Club in 1926 & 1927.

Gus coached the *Old Scotch Collegians Football Club* for seven years from 1935 – 1938 and again in 1948 & 1949, with an A Section premiership year in 1933. He also coached our Juniors in 1954. He was awarded a Life Member of the Club in 1961. Gus died in 1982.
