J. B. James Robinson (“Robbo”)

James Robinson joined the *Old Scotch Collegians Football Club* in 1984 from *Scotch College*. He started his team-managing career by managing our Under 19s team for three years from 1984 – 1986. From 1987 – 1996, he then managed our Warriors team for the next ten years. Then from 1997 - 2001, he managed our Reserves team for four years, before taking over as team manager of our Seniors in 2002 until today, sixteen years later. In 2017, James managed both our Seniors and Reserves teams.

James’s most significant contribution to our club is managing all of our teams for 33 years and for liaising warmly with VAFA umpires.

S. J. Stephen Reddish

Steve Reddish joined the *Old Scotch Collegians Football Club* in 1984 and debuted in our Seniors on 7 April 1984. He then went on to play 160 Seniors plus 16 Reserves games for our club, for a total of 176 games from 1984 – 1995 (12 seasons).

Steve was a Victorian State Representative in 1988. Later, after he retired, Steve coached our Under 19s for four seasons from 2013 – 2016.
